Dispatches from Kingfishers

What have you enjoyed learning about this term?

Easily one of my favourite subjects is biology, you can tell when people study and learn they put animals into different groups. For example, Carl Linnaeus sorted plants, microorganisms and other animals into groups in a process called classification (LG). I love to learn about fractions as we added algebra and BIDMAS into our afternoon maths sessions (KB). I am enjoying DT because we are making playgrounds and it's fun creating your own playground and making things like slides, swings and whatever we want (AW). We have been reading a book called Windrush Child. The boy called

Leonard's father was beaten up by the Teddy Boys and his mother has left his father. The book is helping us to understand and explore the effect of racism (PN). We went to Go Ape and it was really fun because we basically got to live like an ape for a day (TN). I have been enjoying learning about Sparta and Athens because we didn't know that in Sparta at the age of 7 you went to the Agoge to learn how to survive by yourself, how to hunt and learnt to become warriors.

Tell us a funny, silly or cool thing that happened in school this half term.

At Go Ape, I was on a platform with swings and I stepped on it and I went flying forward and I ended up doing the splits in mid air! (LL). It was funny when Ben (the Go Ape worker) went down the wire and dabbed as he went (OL). We did the laser experiment - we shone red lasers through prisms and we discovered that the red light refracted through them (refraction is the action of making light bend) (JT).

What are you looking forward to this half term?

Our next DT project, I am really excited as it is fabrics and I can't wait to make something (GT). I am curious to see if Leonard's dad has actually been unfaithful in our story as I want to know if he is truthful or if he is a liar (PN). I'm excited for two things - we are going to get DNA out of fruit and I am also excited to do some sculpting (IG). I'm looking forward to art and DT and using different materials to make things (MF).

Earlier this year, a pupil in Owls spent nearly 9 weeks in hospital in Leeds, following an accident resulting in a traumatic brain injury. Since coming home, she has been fundraising. Thanks to people's generosity, we're pleased to announce that the sum raised is £2950! £2500 was donated to the neurorehabilitation ward in Leeds to enhance their resources, and £450 to The Millie Wright

Children's Charity, who support families across the whole hospital. The donations will help more children receive life changing help while in hospital. The fundraising has now closed, but if you are interested in donating to the hospital, please see the Leeds Hospitals Charity, who has a Christmas Wishlist to provide toys approved by the Play Therapy team for children who will be in hospital over the Christmas period.

Used Stamp Appeal for the RNIB


