What have you enjoyed learning about this term?

(MM) I like doing art, as we were making our own pictures to use as metaphors. (JL) I have enjoyed English, learning about suffragettes because it tells you about women's lives in the past. (TTC) I have loved learning about geography and the effect of tourism on the Antarctic. I also learnt that there is an organism called lichen which can be endangered by tourists. Looking ahead: key messages and reminders

Attendance

Good attendance and punctuality are vital to children's success in school. Every lesson counts: just 10 minutes late each day adds up to almost 1 hour of lost learning each week, which is over 6 school days across the year. Similarly, 95% attendance may sound positive, but it actually means a child misses around 9–10 school days in a year—almost two full weeks of learning. When attendance drops to 90%, this equates to around 19 days missed, which is nearly four weeks of school. Being in school, on time, every day ensures children do not miss key teaching, important instructions and valuable learning opportunities. Thank you for your continued support in helping your child attend regularly and arrive promptly each day.

Helmets

As the weather encourages more children to travel to school by bike or scooter, we would like to remind families of the importance of wearing a helmet every time. Helmets play a vital role in protecting children from serious head injuries and help to keep them safe while enjoying their independence. We also encourage adults to model this behaviour—children are far more likely to wear their helmets consistently when they see parents and carers doing the same. By working together and setting a positive example, we can help ensure everyone stays safe on their journeys to and from school.

Playing out in the dark

As the evenings remain darker for longer, we would like to remind families to take extra care if children are playing outside after school. While outdoor play is important and enjoyable, it is essential that children are supervised appropriately and remain in safe, well-lit areas. Please ensure they are aware of road safety, stay within agreed boundaries and can be easily seen by others—bright or reflective clothing can make a big difference. By taking a few simple precautions, we can help keep all of our children safe while they enjoy time outdoors.





Parking

We have recently received a number of complaints from local residents regarding parking on the roads surrounding the school. We kindly ask all parents and carers to be considerate when dropping off and collecting children, ensuring that driveways are not blocked, corners are kept clear and parking restrictions are followed at all times. Please do not park on double yellow lines or within designated parking restriction zones, as these are in place to ensure the safety of all road users, particularly our children. Inconsiderate parking not only causes frustration for our neighbours but can

also create significant safety risks for our pupils. We appreciate your cooperation in helping us maintain positive relationships with our local community and in keeping everyone safe.
